Sulfur Induced Toxicity

Dr. Dan Gould, Colorado State University

As a member of the applied pathology service group at the Colorado State Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory and the Department of Microbiology, Immunology and Pathology at Colorado State University, Dr. Gould's activities include investigating and teaching about naturally-occurring animal diseases. He is also involved in the Pathology Residency/PhD training program, which provides a post-DVM training experience to produce broad-based investigators capable of bringing naturally-occurring animal disease problems to the research laboratory and bringing research laboratory information and activities to bear on the study of naturally-occurring disease.

Dr. Gould's investigative activities focus on nutritional and toxicologic pathology with an emphasis on neuropathology and disturbed ruminal function. Investigations are directed at understanding the factors governing the production of excessive ruminal hydrogen sulfide and sulfide-induced brain injury in ruminants. Ruminal disturbances associated with acute interstitial pneumonia of feedlot cattle have also been investigated. An additional area of activity involves surveillance for transmissible spongiform encephalopathies in cattle, sheep and cervids (BSE, scrapie, and CWD respectively). Dr. Gould is also a participant in the Integrated Livestock Management Program at CSU.

Robert G. Riley, Jr., has worked for more than 30 years in the oil processing industry and for the past 20 years has directed the operations of Feed Energy Company as President and CEO. Headquartered in Des Moines, FEC is an agribusiness firm primarily engaged in processing soybean oil co-products focused in feed, agronomy, dust control, fuel, and industrial and fertilizer applications. The company is one of the largest acidulators of soybean soapstock in the North America and produces scientifically balanced ingredients

specific to their customers' needs. In 2006 Riley formed FEC Solutions to pursue opportunities within the ethanol and biodiesel industries.

Bob has a life-long interest in the environment that has resulted in his extensive involvement in rural development, sustainable agriculture, and land use. Last year Iowa's governor appointed Bob to the Economic Development Board of Directors. He also serves on several local and state agricultural and environmental boards and committees including IaAgState, a strategic agriculture policy group, the Iowa Environmental Council, Water for Iowans, The Nature Conservancy, and Whiterock Conservancy, the Greater Des Moines Community Foundation, and the Des Moines Water Works.
